

Memory and history have always played an important role in diplomacy. However, it is only in recent years that more and more scholars have begun to integrate memory and the use of history into theories of International Relations (IR). Therefore, the 12th edition of the Genealogies of Memory conference entitled **History and Memory in International Relations** will be devoted to the ways in which memory influences IR, how various actors around the world use the past, how such uses are likely to develop in the future, and which methodologies are best suited for the study of those issues.

The conference will consist of eight panels, a roundtable discussion and three keynote lectures delivered by leading experts: **Prof. Georges Mink**, who will speak about *Geopolitics, History and Memory Games: Jumping from the 20th to the 21st century*, **Prof. Beata Ociepka**, who will present the topic *History in International Relations: A Roadmap or Just a Context?* and **Prof. Zheng Wang** with a contribution on *Historical Memory and Wars: From Ukraine to Taiwan*.
